

Pound House Cottage

The 1841 census lists John Winton with his wife and son in Hyde Street. His son is a shoe maker and is listed as such in Kelly's directory.

At Pound House are two households: John Thompson, aged 60, independent, his wife and Mary Goddard, 75. The other family was of Henry Nash, 25, agricultural labourer, his wife and son.

The 1851 census shows John Winton, his wife and son, now described as cordwainer, at Pound House with the Thompsons.

The cottage remained divided between two households until fairly recent times but is now owned by one family.

It has been surveyed by Dr Annabelle Hughes who describes a three-bay house with a thatched roof, the original build dating to c1500. Chimney stacks were later inserted c1650 and c1700.

A note on the back of one of the photographs states that the freehold of Pound House Cottage was sold in 1956 for £1,950 with a garden of $\frac{1}{4}$ acre.
